

Remote Learning FAQ's

When will Hawthorn Leadership School for Girls be back in session?

All schools located in both the city are following the Mayor's stay at home order. Schools are currently closed until April 22nd. Should there be any change to this return date, we will communicate with families as soon as those details become available.

What if I don't have Wi-Fi at home or a reliable internet service provider?

Charter is offering free Spectrum broadband and Wi-Fi access for 60 days to households with K-12 and/or college students who do not already have a Spectrum broadband subscription and at any service level up to 100 Mbps. To enroll call **1-844-488-8395**. Installation fees will be waived for new student households.

We will continue to communicate any other opportunities that may become available for our families to receive Wi-Fi access.

Will students receive grades for assignments during their time outside of school?

Students will be assigned work during the remote learning time with deadlines by which that work needs to be sent to teachers. Teachers will provide feedback and students will be provided a grade for those assignments. Hawthorn is still determining how final grades will be calculated.

Will Hawthorn girls be required to participate in MAP testing this year?

Missouri has cancelled the required statewide assessments for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year. This includes the MAP test for students in grades 3-8, the End of Course Assessments and the MAP- A Alternate assessment.

Will my student still be able to receive breakfast and lunch?

Breakfast and lunch services will continue to be provided throughout various locations in the city. Please refer to www.slps.org/meals for updates.
