The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m. by Kathryn Love

The Finance Committee Report was led by Rachana Creeth. The accounting firm of Kerber Eck Braeckel LLP presented the 2019-20 Audit of the School's financials. The 2019-20 Audit was moved, seconded, and approved unanimously by the Board.

The Consent Agenda was moved, seconded, and approved unanimously.

The Head of School Update was given by Daphne Robinson. She described the plan for bringing student instruction back into building on November 2. Staff has surveyed families about their interest in moving to in-person hybrid model; approximately 40 scholars plan to return. We will be stress testing the building and systems by having staff teaching from the building for two weeks prior to November 2. In addition, the school has given NWEA assessments and STAR testing for reading to some of our students, and the results were reported on.

Kathryn Love kicked off the board SWOT analysis by giving a historical retrospective of Hawthorn, its prior two strategic plans and the discussion focus for the meeting.
