- Effective professional skills, a positive, team-centered personality, and a dedication to life-long learning are all necessary for teaching success

- Actively engage in school-wide expectations for instructional planning including lesson plan unpacking and internalization. Use assessment data to refine curriculum and inform instructional practices
- Participate in all school-wide planning, grade-level activities, and academic meetings related to student progress.

- Execute high-quality instruction to high school girls to facilitate growth and progress toward mastery of academic standards.
- Utilize a variety of instructional strategies based on the diverse needs of all the students that engage all students.
